



Courtesy Review for Your Initial Protocol or Amendment

Protocols, and their amendments, frequently involve billables and require careful attention to ensure proper documentation, communication, and adherence to relevant regulations and policies. These changes can impact the budget, funding, and overall study design, and may require a Coverage Analysis (CA). A Coverage Analysis is a process of determining how each billable item and service should be billed helping ensure compliance with Medicare and other payer guidelines.

Some important updates from the May 2025 issue include:

Research Participant Payments - Emory recently received several non-compliance notices from the IRS with significant fines and penalties levied.
Upon their review/audit, it was noted that incorrect TIN numbers were reported for a significant number of participants, resulting in 1099 and other tax filings containing inaccurate information. To address this ongoing issue, while ensuring IRS compliance, a validation step when entering a social security number has been implemented in the Greenphire Clincard

 SciENcv - NIH's adoption of SciENcv for Biographical Sketch and a new Biographical Sketch Supplement originally scheduled for May 25, 2025, is postponed. Deadline for Compliance with NIH's Public Access Policy Accelerated

NIH Accelerates Effective Implementation Date for Public Access Policy to July 1, 2025. The biggest difference between the new NIH Public Access Policy and the current one that's been in effect since 2008 (updated in 2013) is that the new one requires **immediate** public access to journal articles reporting on the results of NIH-funded research (the current policy allows a 12-month post-publication embargo). Delayed access in the form of embargoes is disallowed; public access must coincide with the formal publication of the article. Researchers can comply with the public access requirement by depositing either their final peer-reviewed manuscript or their final published article in PubMed Central. Most major publishers will deposit articles on behalf of authors. You can learn more about this process at this PubMed Central information page for authors.
